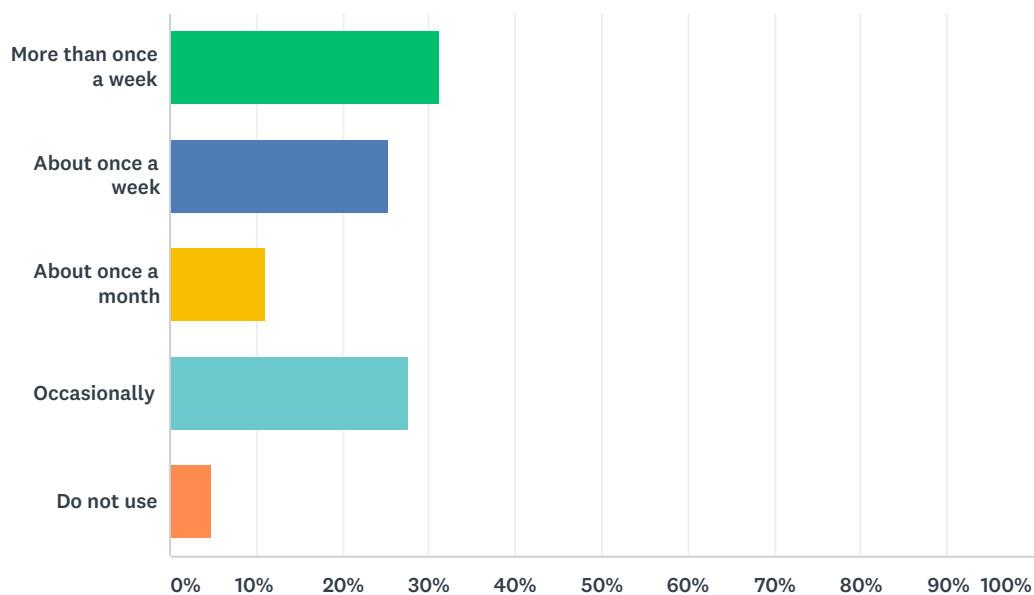


Q1 How often do you visit the site and / or use the buildings?

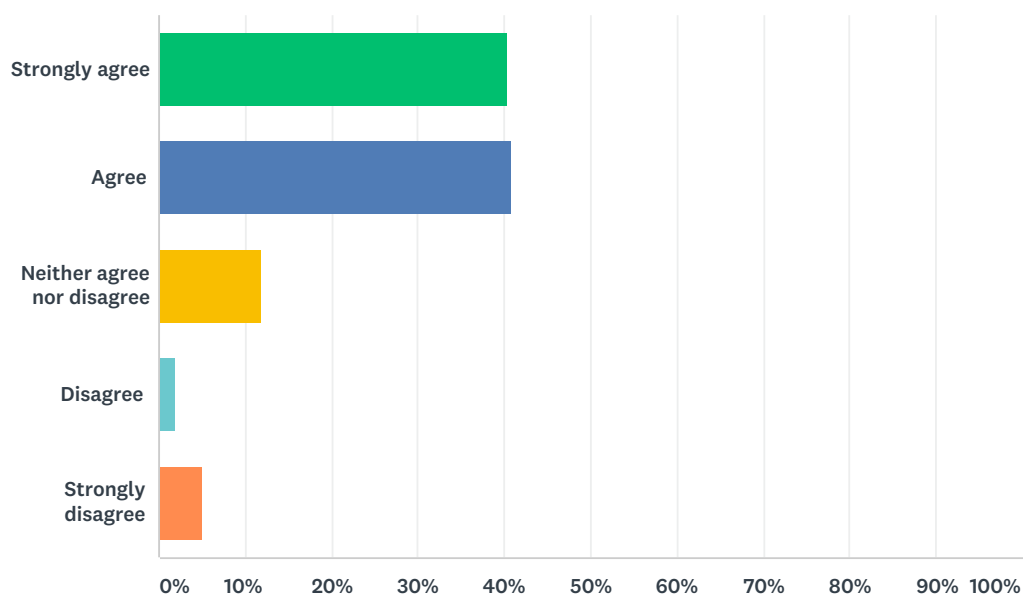

Q2 The pavilion and scout hut should be replaced by a joint new building.

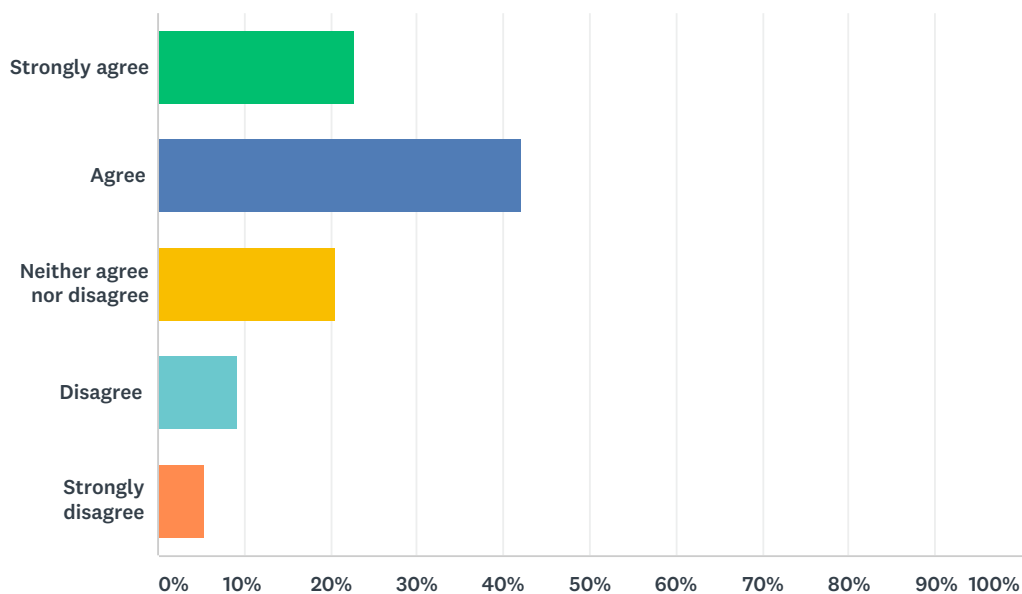

Q3 The new building should be about the same size as the combined size of the current scout and pavilion building.

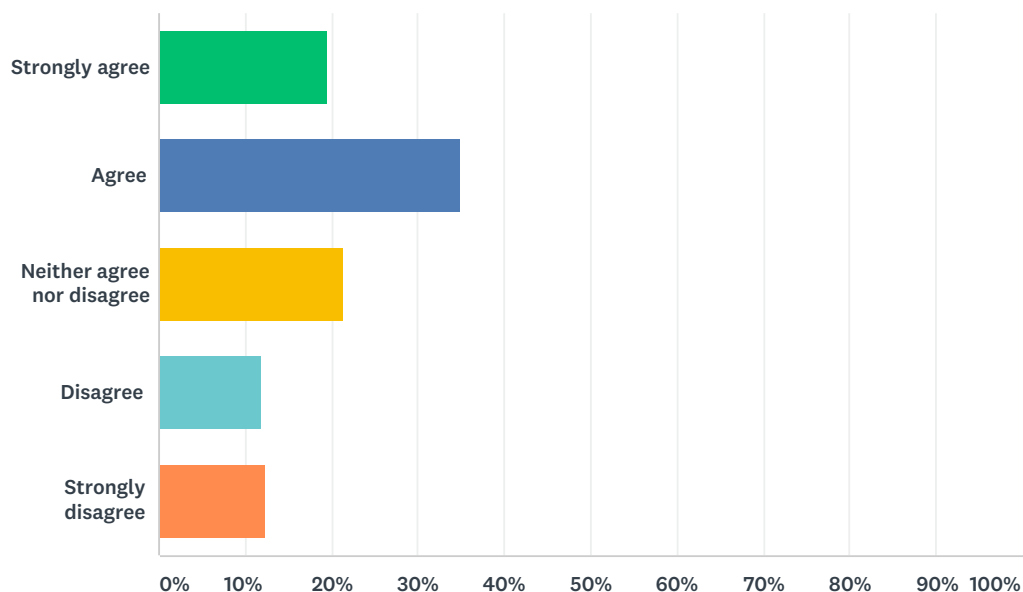

Q4 The new building should have up to a maximum of 10 car parking spaces next to it including disabled parking.

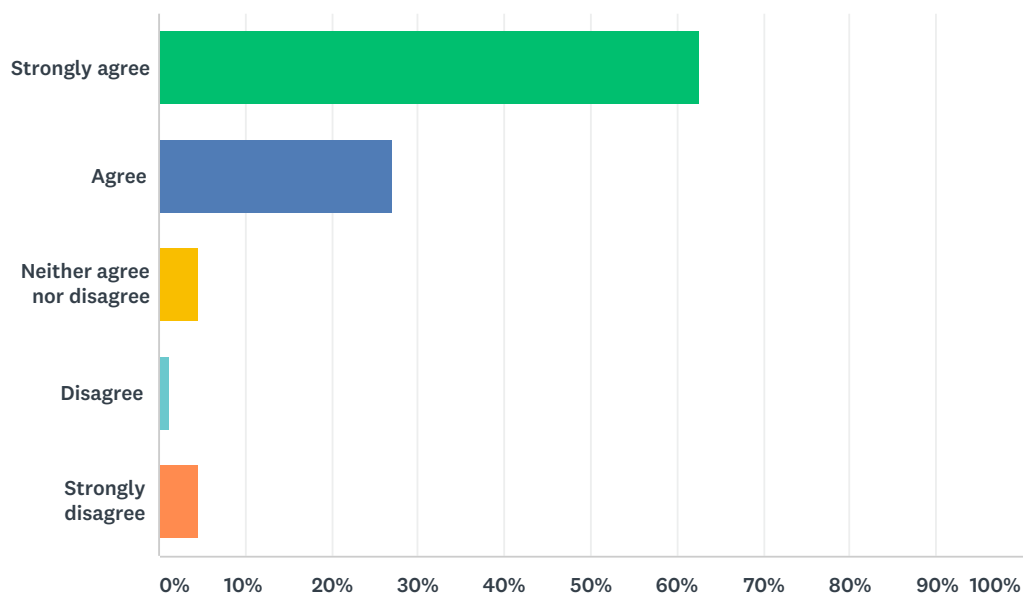

Q5 Cycle parking should be provided at the building.

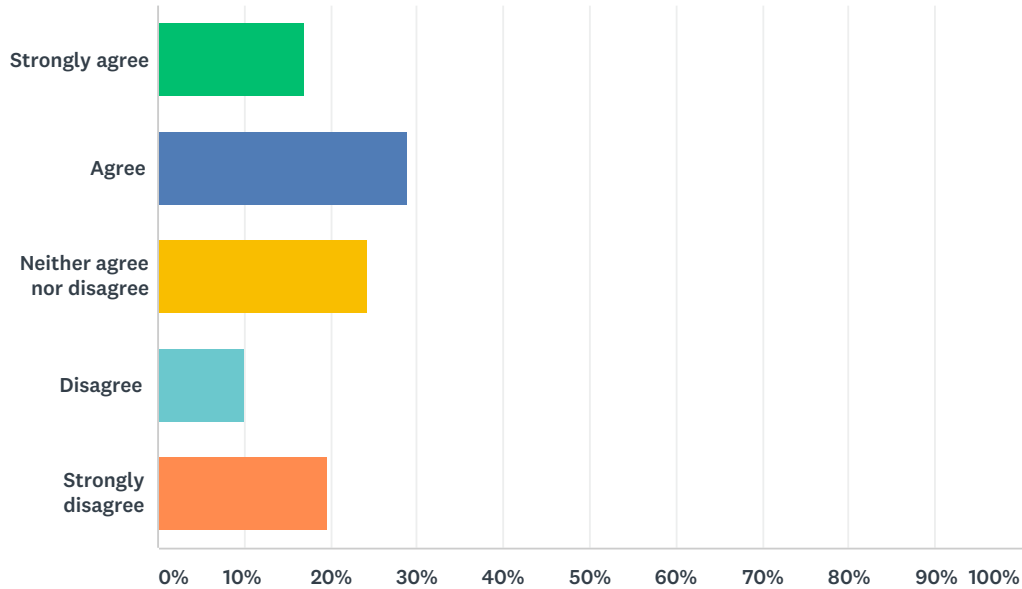

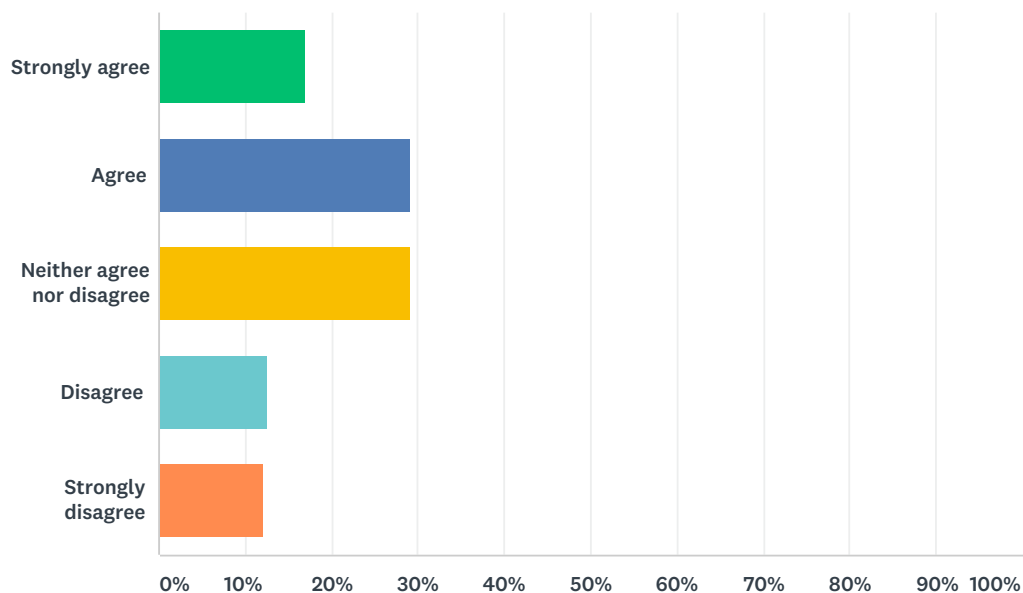

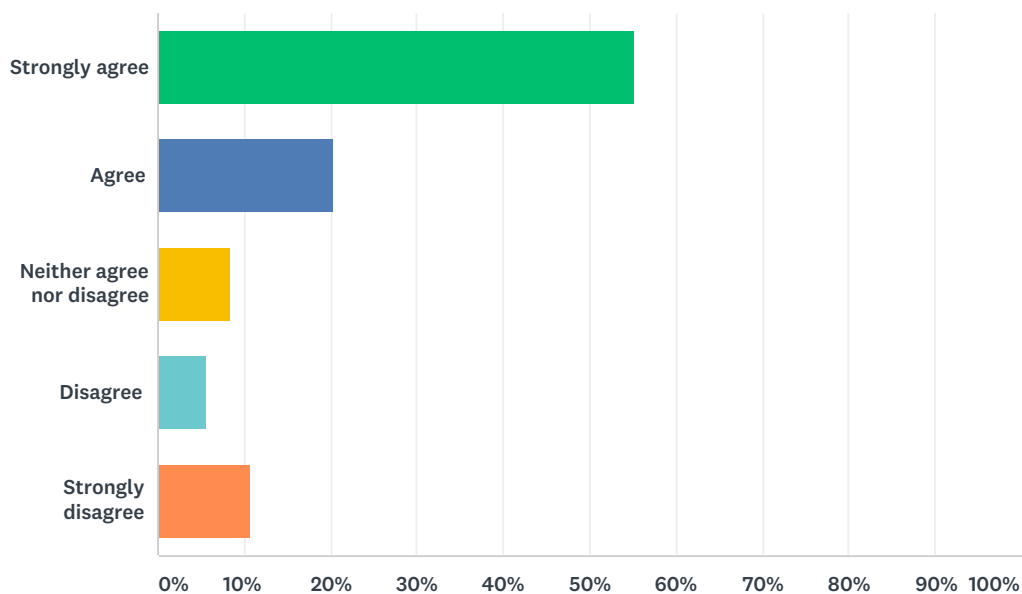

Q9 There should be new youth adventure and fitness equipment such as a climbing rig, zip-wire and outdoor exercise stations.

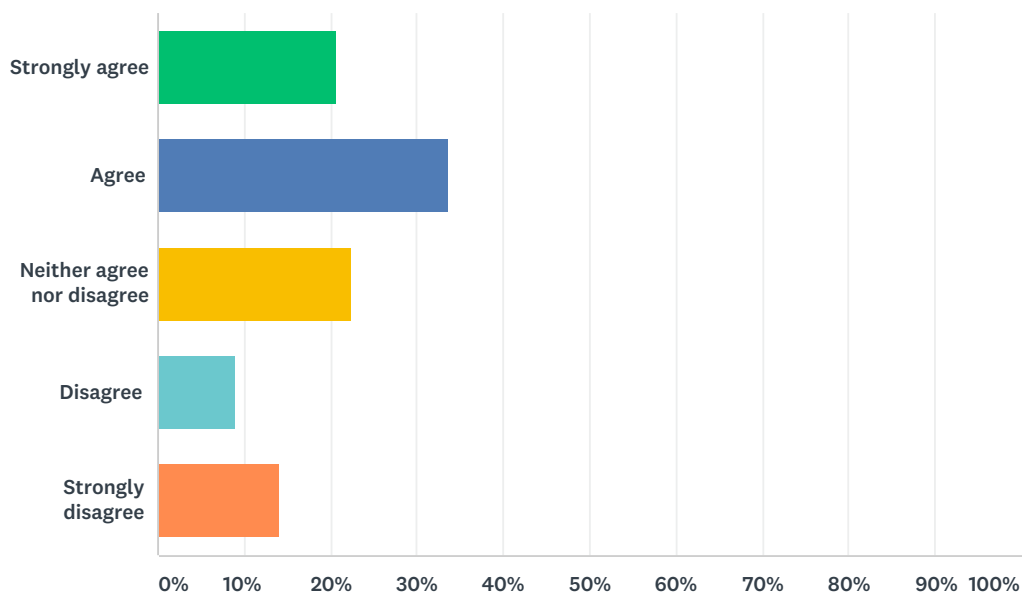

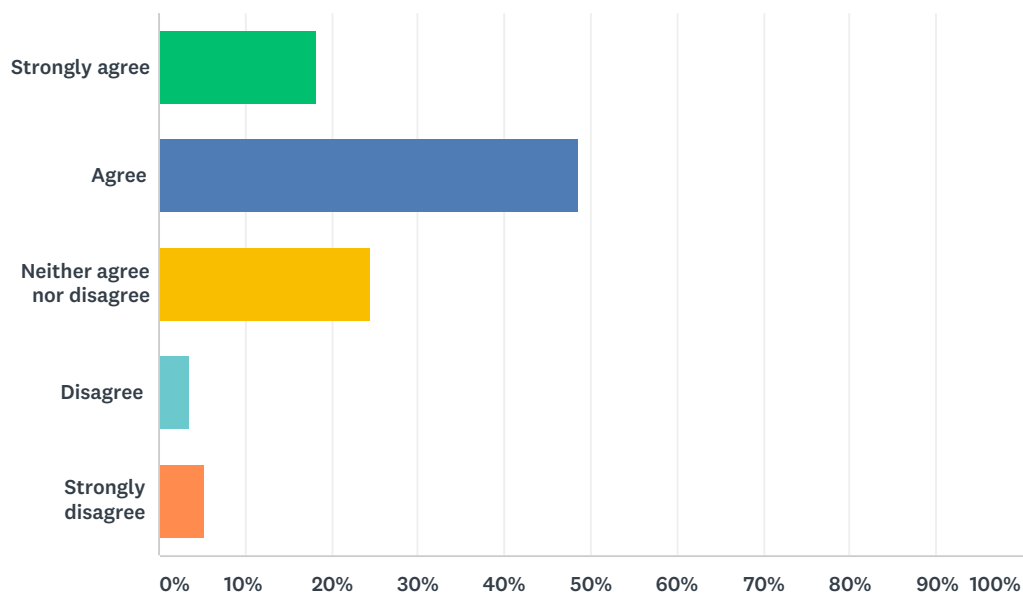

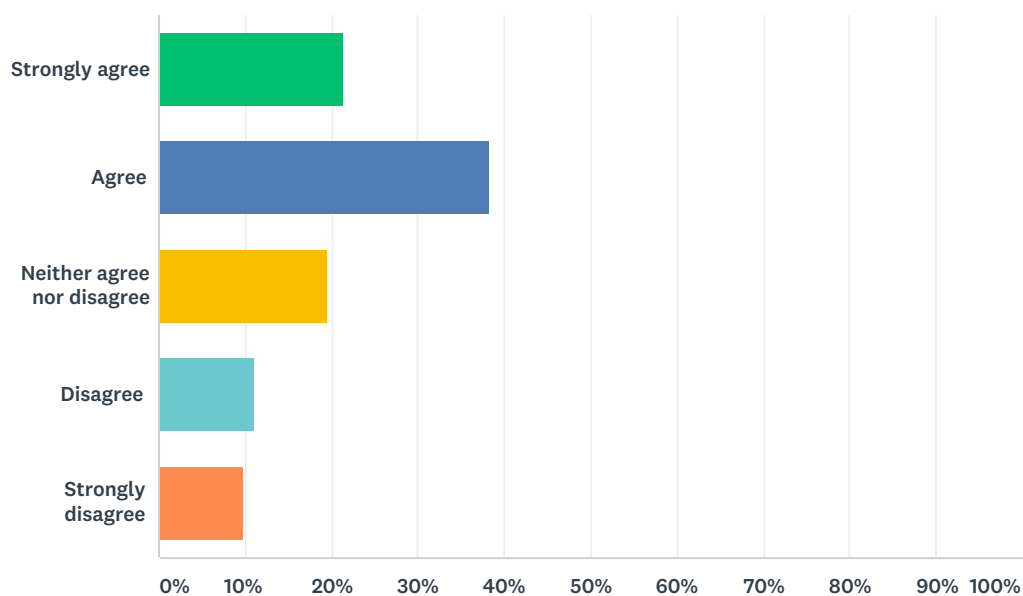

Q12 The Fields should be improved for walkers, joggers and dog walkers by adding or improving paths.

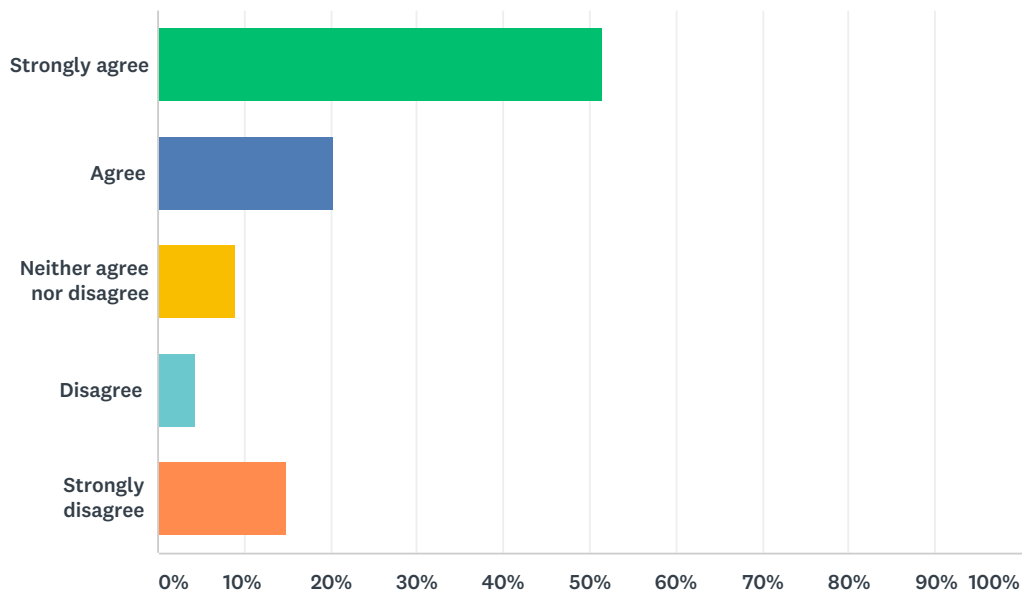

Q13 A skatepark should be provided. It would be about the same size as the multi use games area and would be located behind it in the Upper Field, near the site of the previous skate bowl.

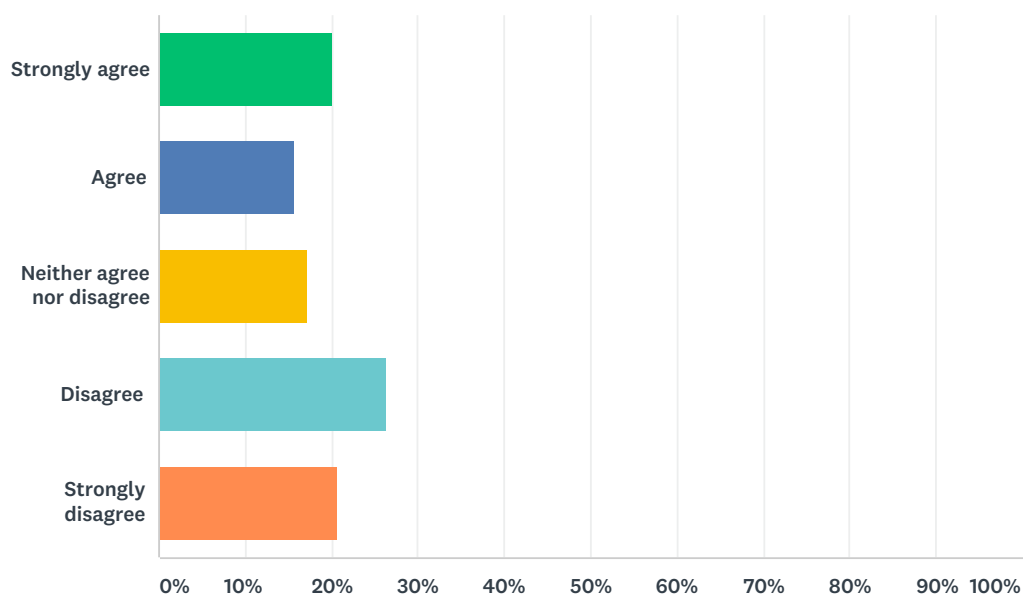

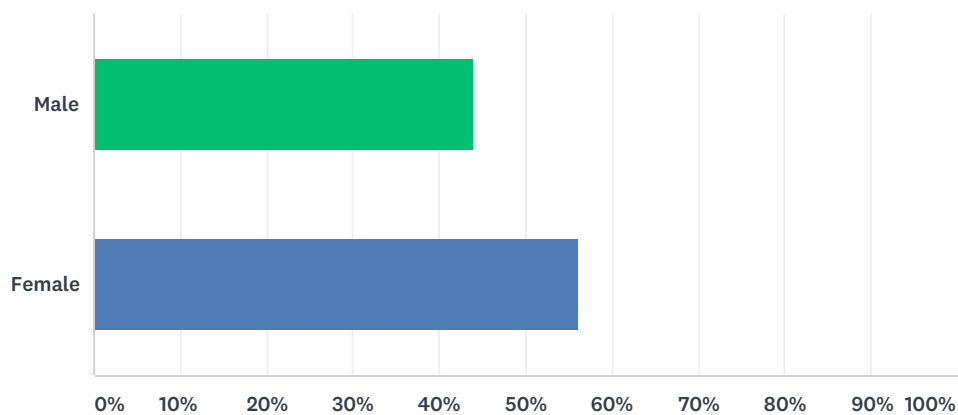
